Congratulations to Dr Anne Touboulic, Prof Richard Hyde, and Dr Lucy McCarthy who have been awarded a British Academy small grant to investigate the 'hidden' relationships underpinning the narratives of 'food safety'. The project is titled: A critical narrative approach to food safety in the UK: A (hi)story of milk.

Dr Tania Dottorini has been awarded funding from BBSRC for a project titled: **Fighting Infection and AMR in broiler farming: artificial intelligence, omics and smart sensing for diagnostics, forecasting, treatment selection and gut microbiome improvement.** 

PhD candidate Ika Nurzijah won the oral presentation prize at the online Avian Research Symposium 2022. Ika is part of the Graduate Centre for International Agriculture PhD scheme, in partnership with Rothamsted Research. Her project is titled: Plant-based vaccines for prevention of poultry viral diseases: Newcastle disease.

### Food Innovation Centre experts share sensory science knowledge

Experts at the Food Innovation Centre at the University of Nottingham can support small and medium-sized food and drink producers in Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire with a range of matters including NPD, packaging, sustainability and a whole lot more. The team can also arrange bespoke sessions to tackle specific issues.

Nottingham-based food manufacturer and cashew champion Origin Kitchen recently called on the expertise of the Food Innovation Centre by taking part in a sensory science workshop to help staff learn about sensory science and how sensory descriptive profiling can be used to provide accurate descriptions of their products' sensory properties. This allows for better communication about the products – with each other and with consumers. The workshop involved some theory and a demo of how to set up and carry out a descriptive profiling session, using some of Origin Kitchen's own products to create a lexicon of descriptors.

## Publications from Future Food

A new study by Prof Festo Massawe, Dr Sean Mayes and colleagues investigates natural genotypic variation in Bambara groundnut to identify adaptive differences in tap root length (TRL) and root length density (RLD) in response to drought stress.

Using legacy soil information for agricultural research and development can help in places where new soil information is limited due to the cost of soil surveys. However, there are limitations to this approach. A new paper from Prof Murray Lark and colleagues explores the case of soil maps in Zambia.

A paper from Dr Tania Dottorini and others shows the connections between animals, humans and environments in antibiotic resistance, providing insight into the broader epidemiology of antimicrobial resistance in livestock farming.

PhD candidate Ika Nurzijah leads a paper in journal Vaccines on the development of plant-based vaccines for diseases in poultry, including avian flu and Newcastle disease.

Colleagues from UNMC have published in Sustainability on waste management methods for food waste, using Malaysia as a case study.

A new meta-analysis of all relevant studies concerning the environmental impact of oil crop production has been published in Science of the Total Environment. Led by Dr Thomas Alcock, the study reveals the extent of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions caused by vegetable oil production.
